Holocaust survivor, renowned scholar, and author, Nechama Tec will be joined by other inspiring speakers in a discussion of how the Jewish community can most effectively act with our allies in the struggle against anti-Semitism and hatred. Dr. Tec is Professor Emerita of Sociology at the University of Connecticut. She received her PhD from Columbia University, where she served on the faculty for more than a decade. Her work focuses on the intricate relationships between self-preservation, compassion, altruism, rescue, resistance, cooperation, and gender.
